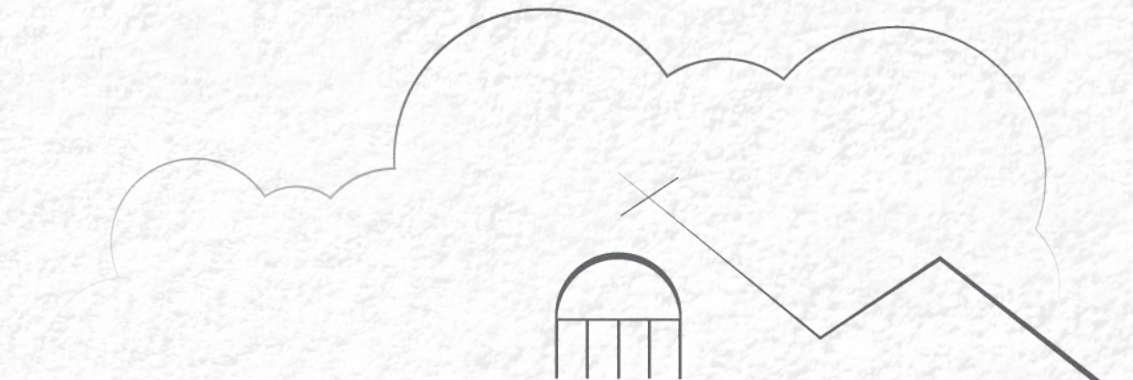

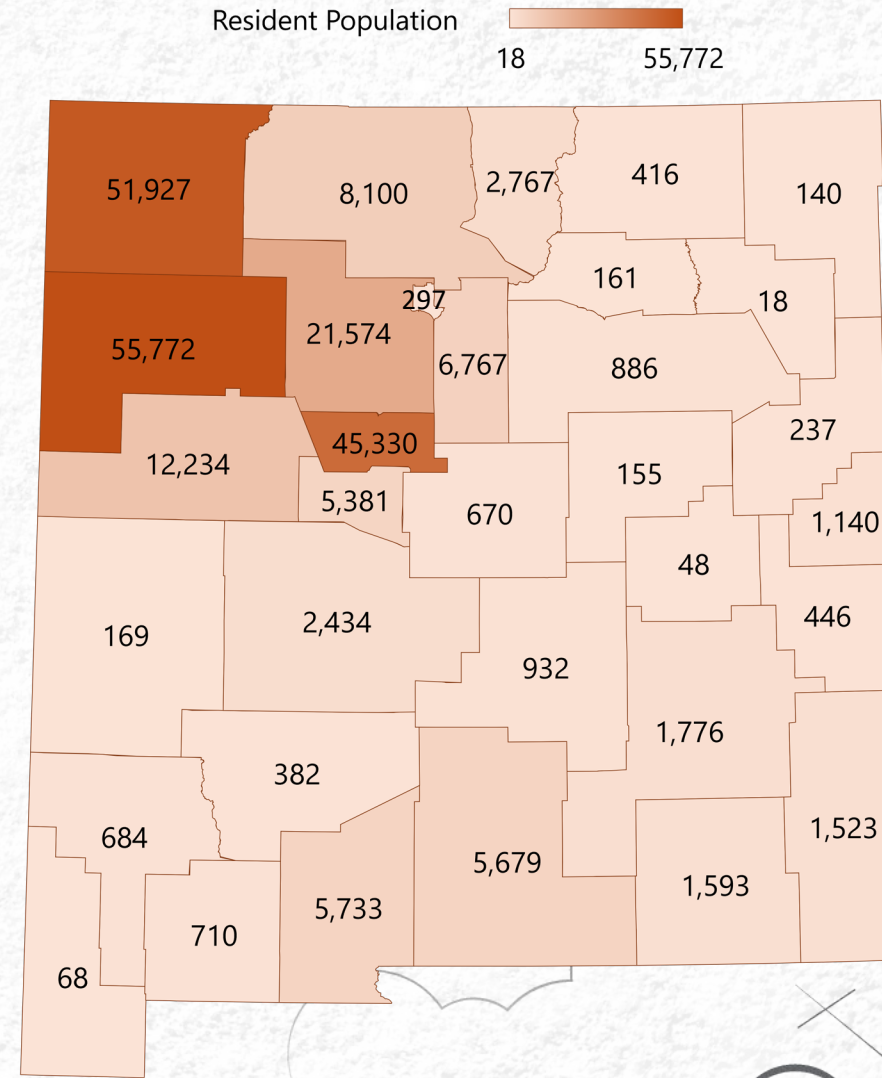
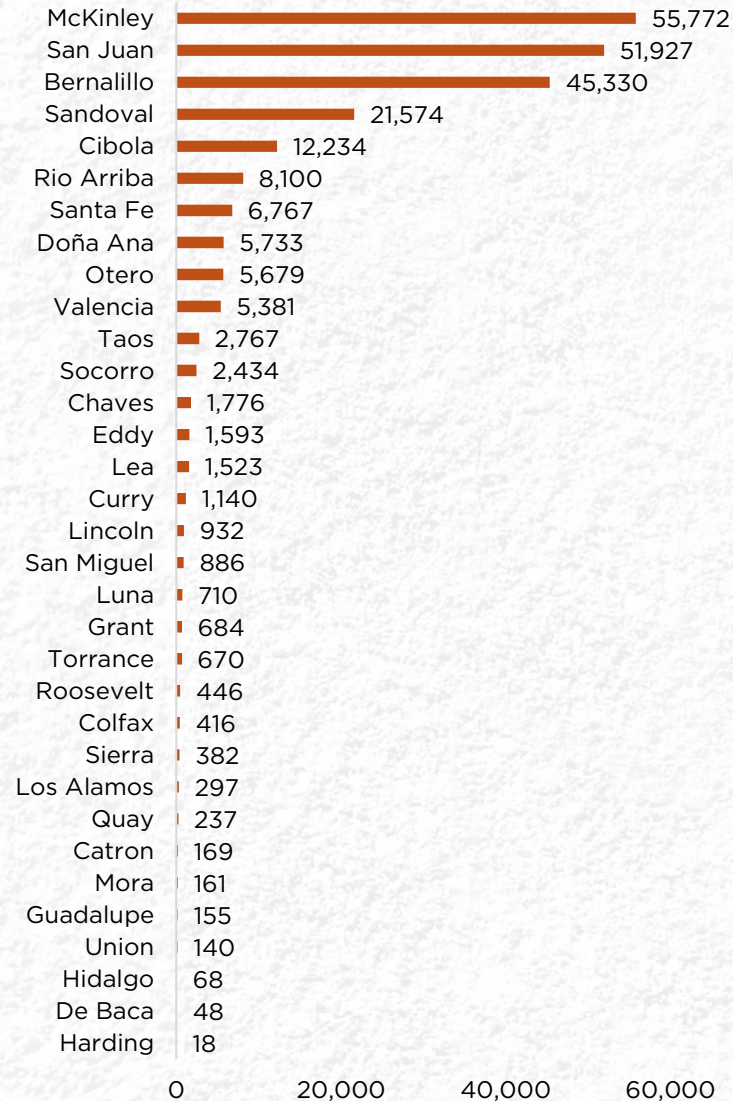

# Native American Resident Population by County in New Mexico, 2022

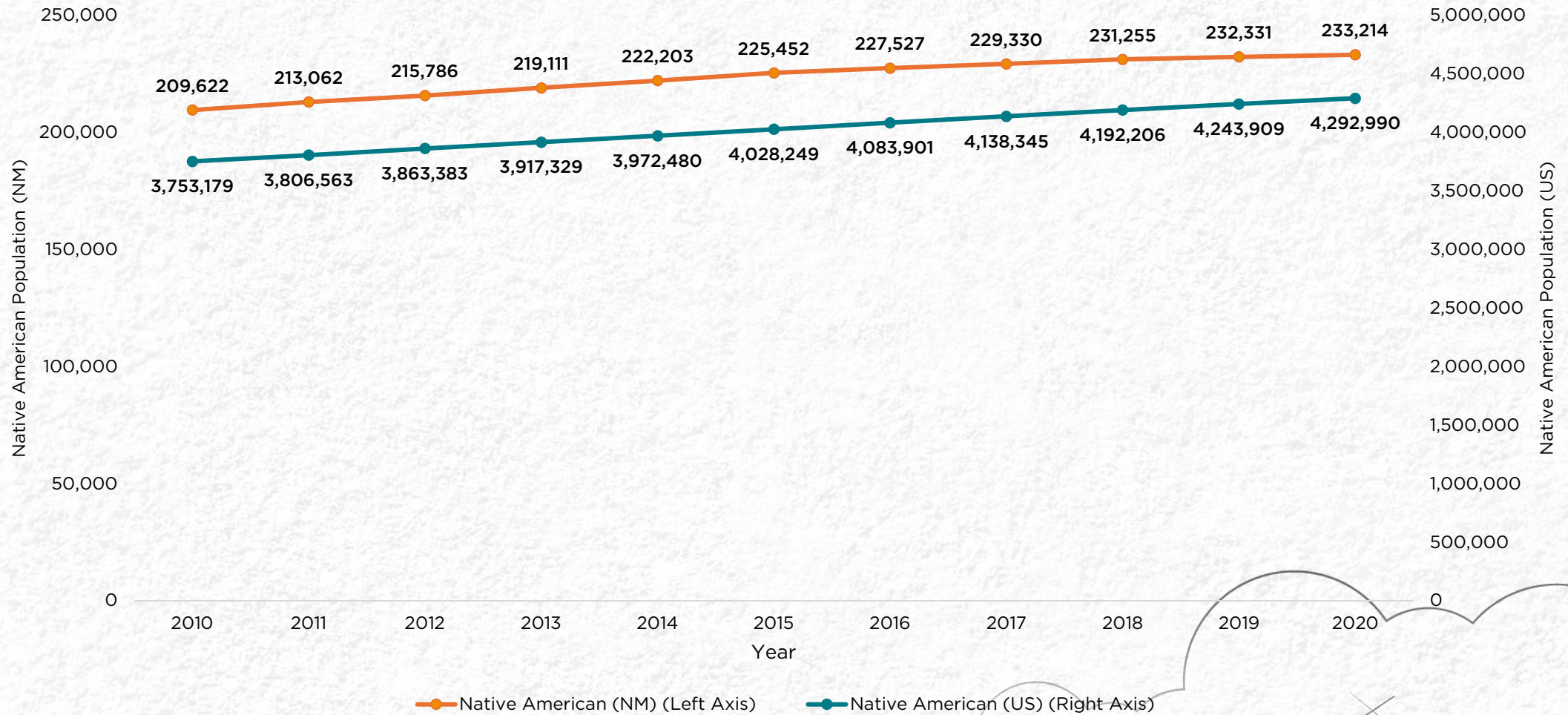

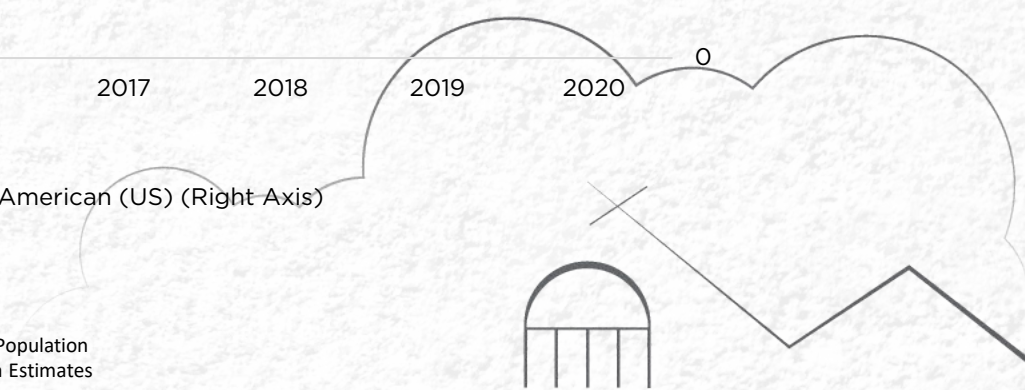




## Native Americans Resident Population in New Mexico and US, 2010-2020

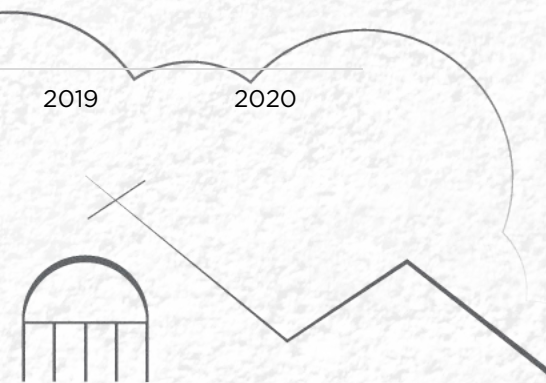
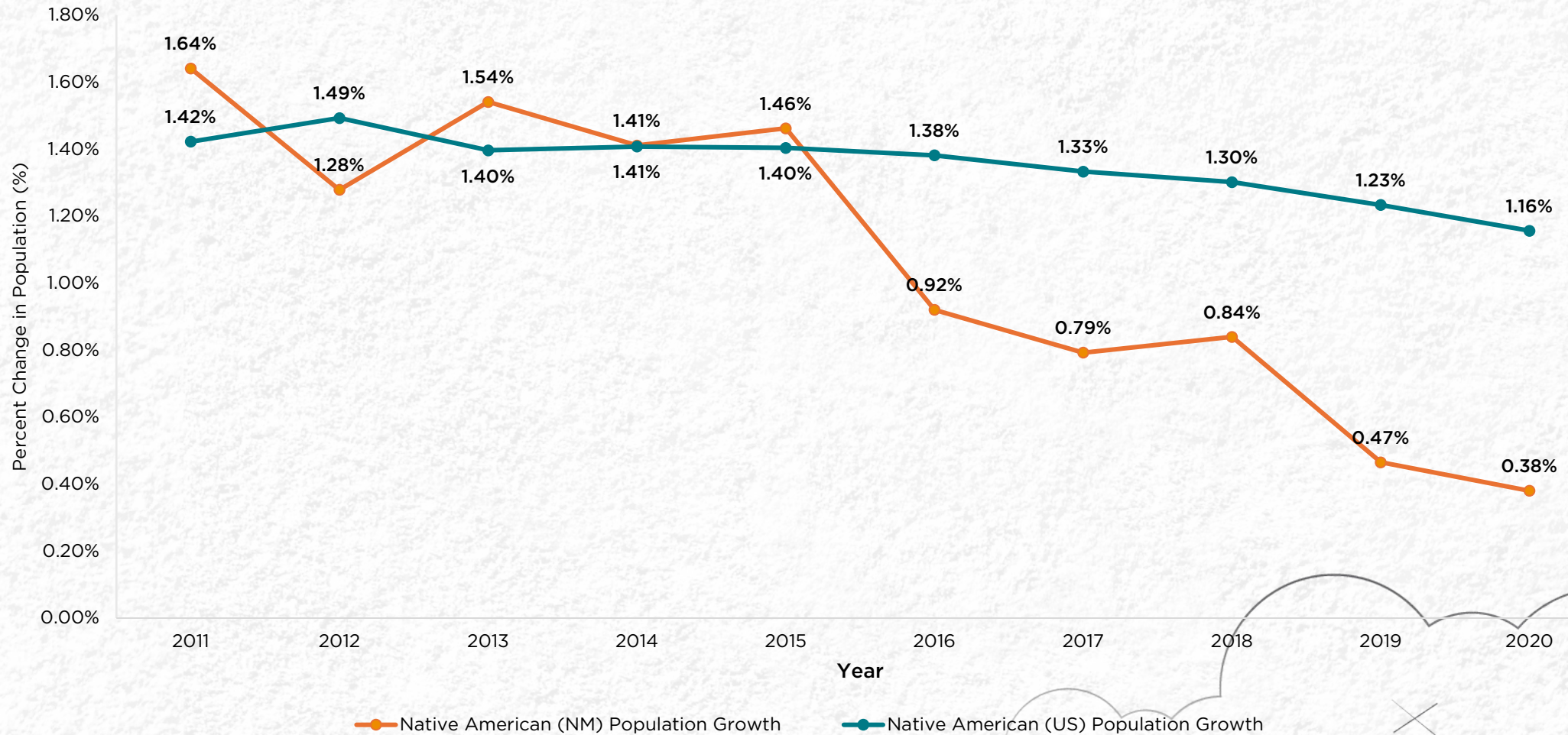

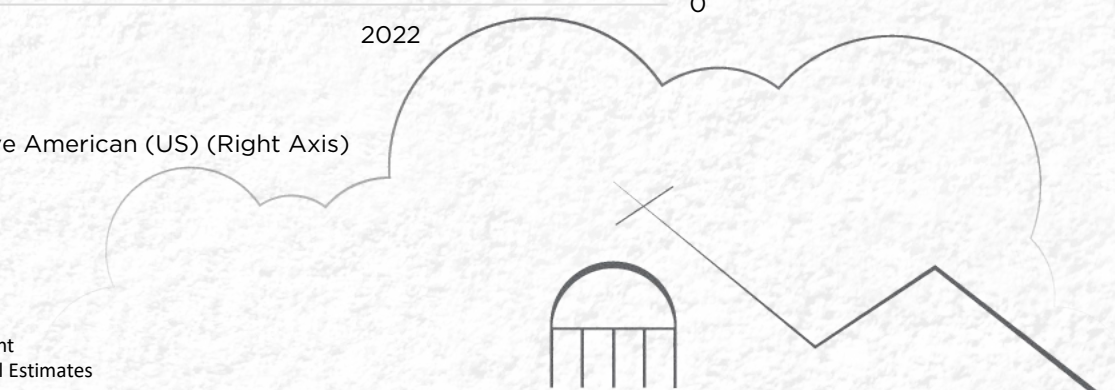
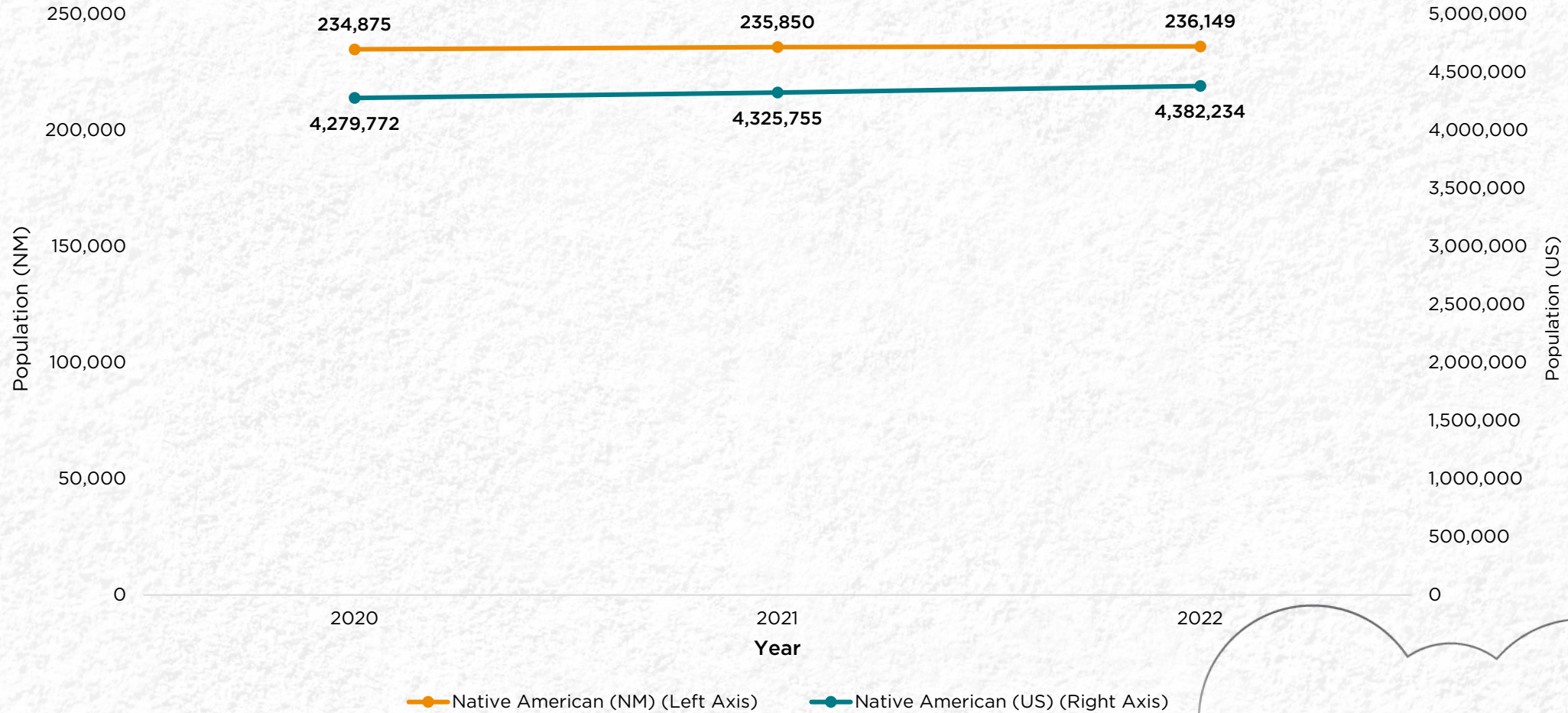


## Native American Resident Population Growth in New Mexico and US, 2011-2020



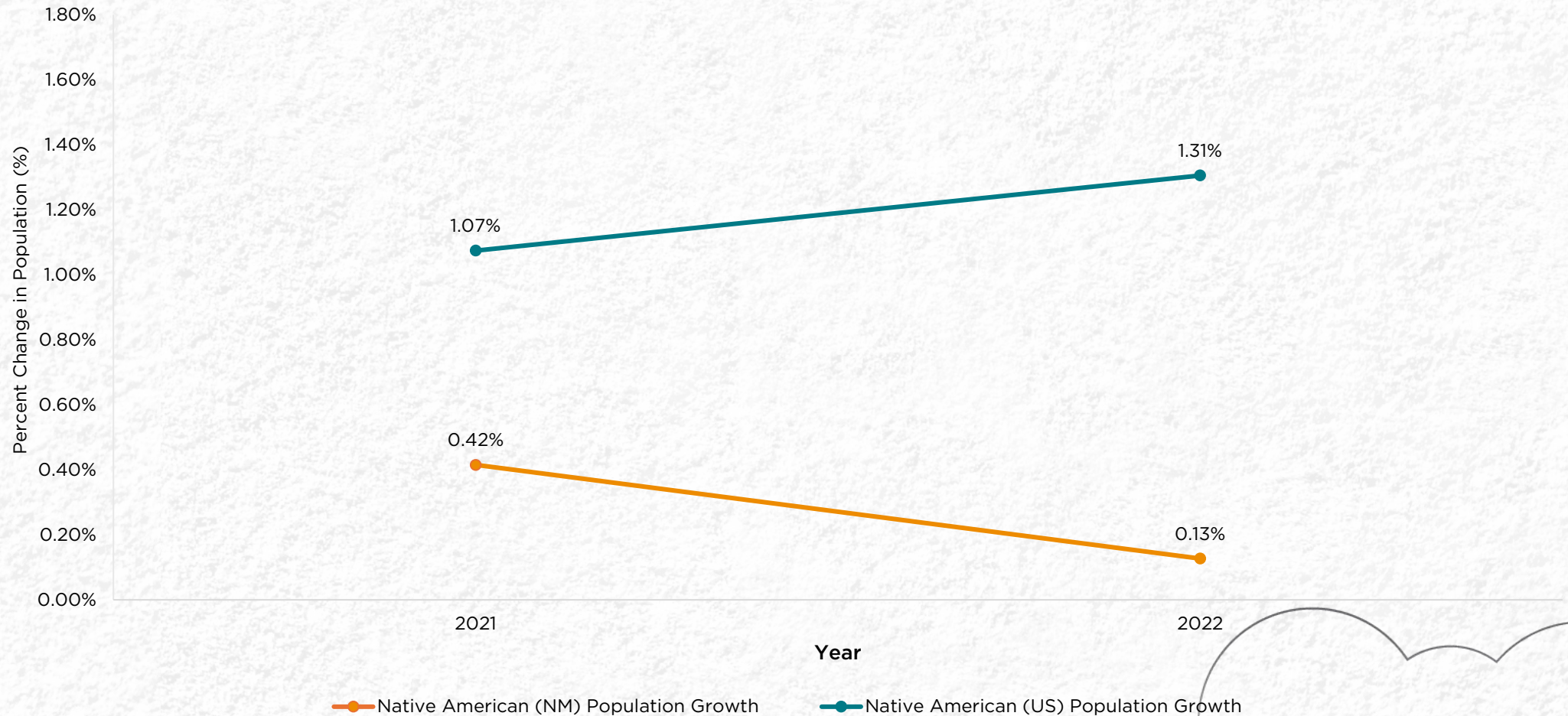


## Native American Resident Population in New Mexico and US, 2020-2022

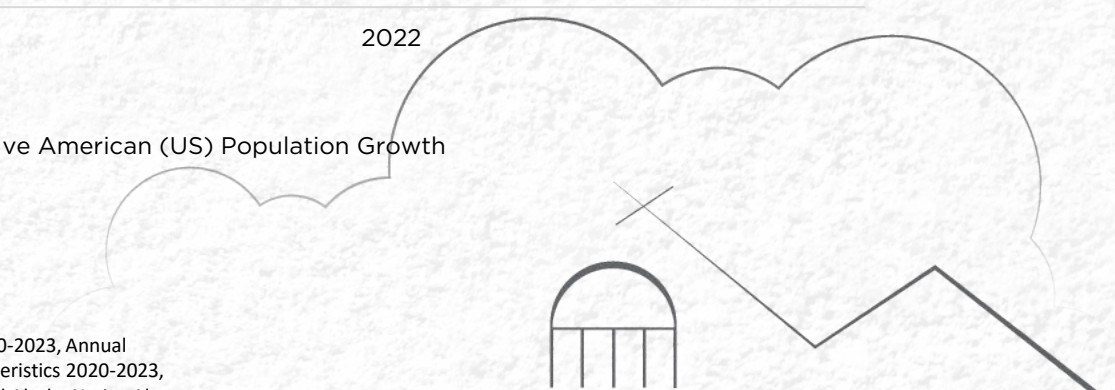




## Native American Resident Population Growth in New Mexico and US, 2021-2022

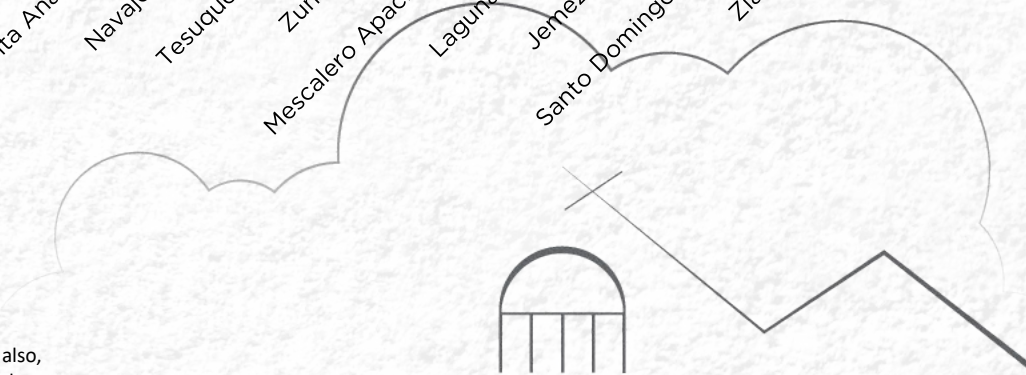
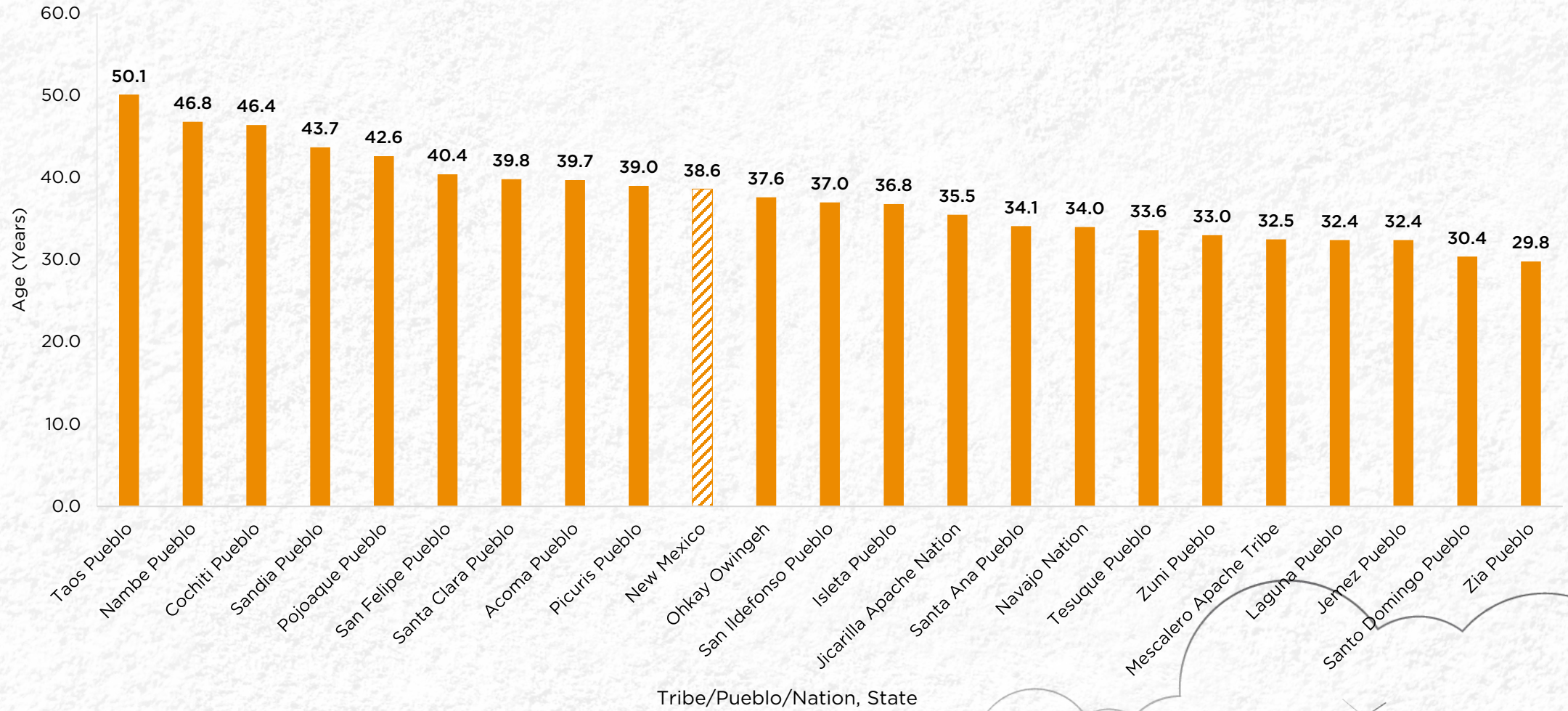


## Native American Population by Tribe, Pueblo, and Nation in New Mexico, 2022



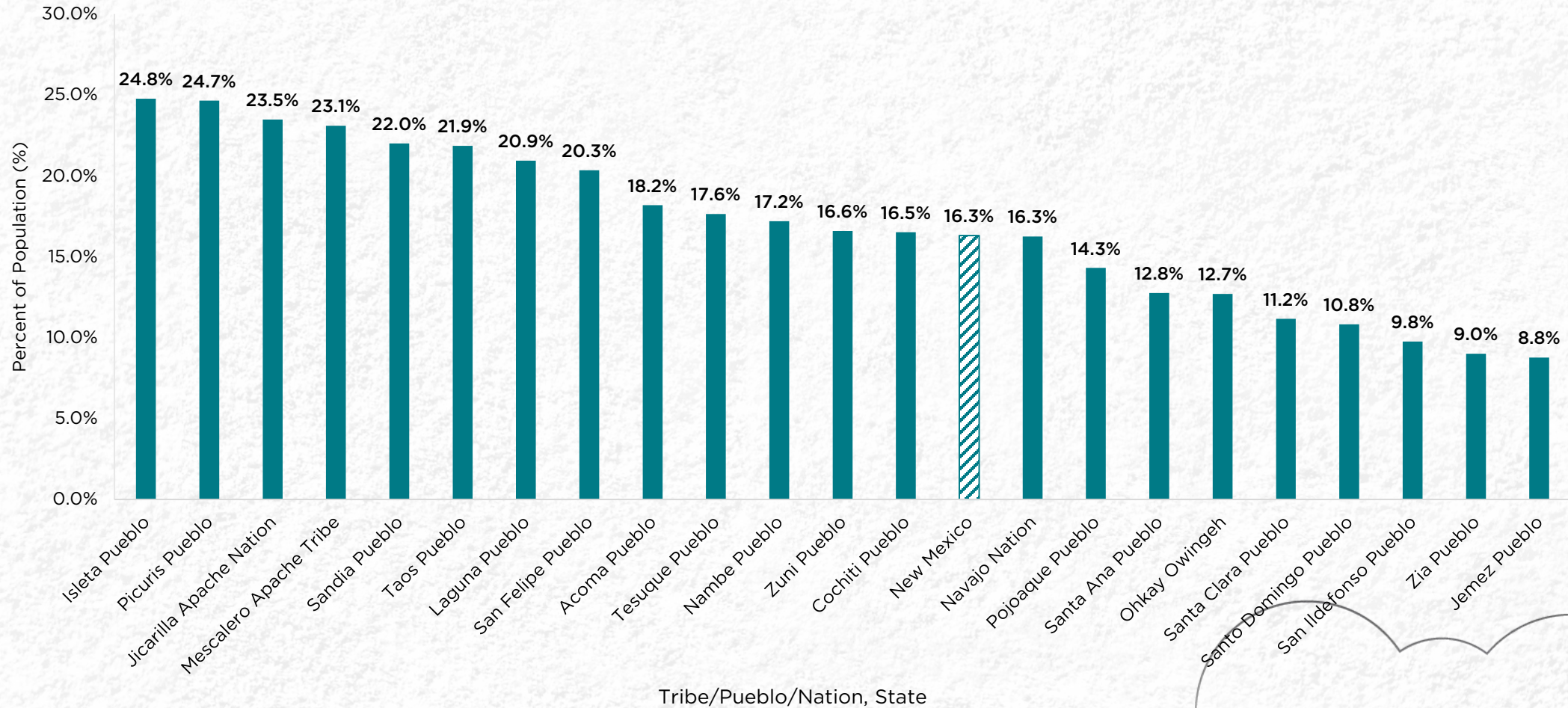


## Median Age of Residents by Tribe, Pueblo, and Nation in New Mexico, 2022



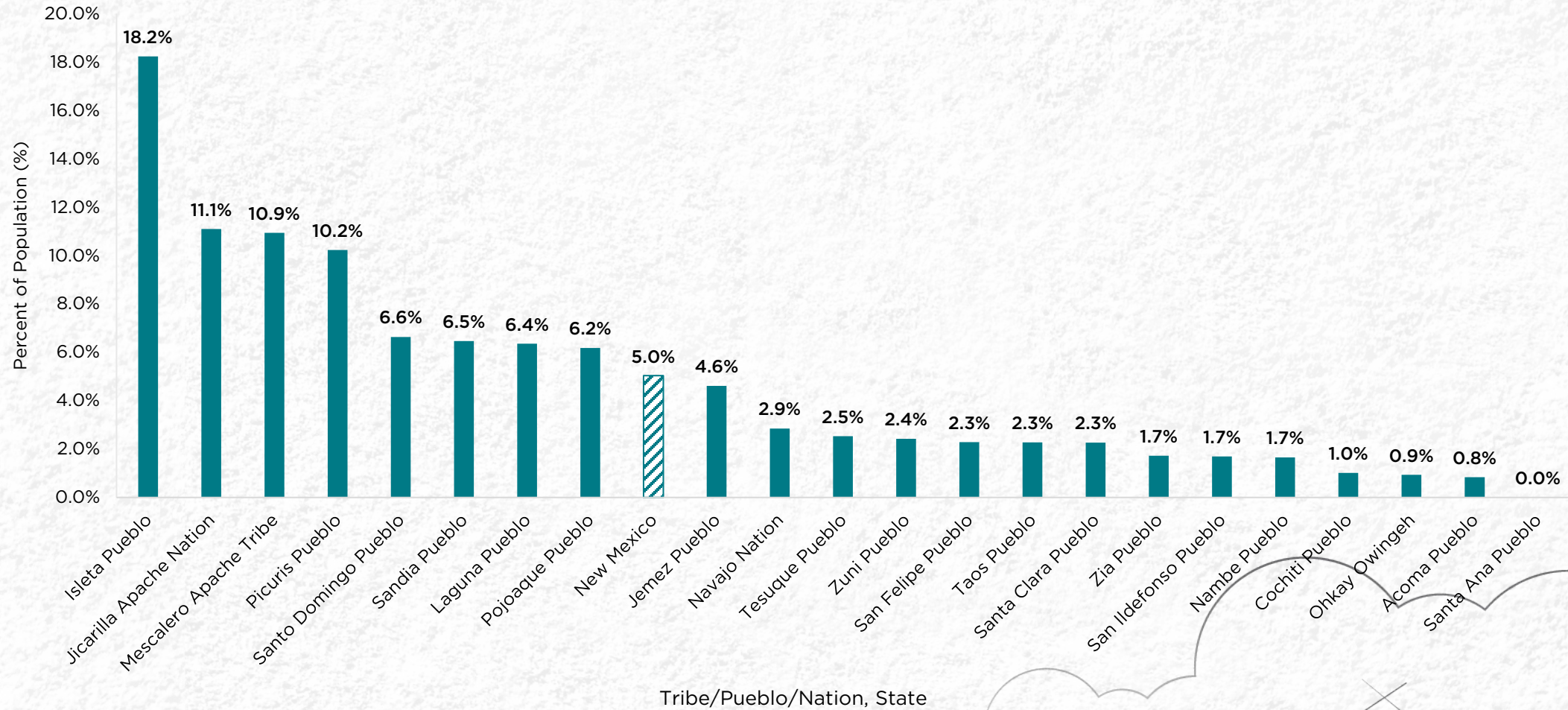


## Percent of Population with a Disability by Tribe, Pueblo, and Nation in New Mexico, 2022



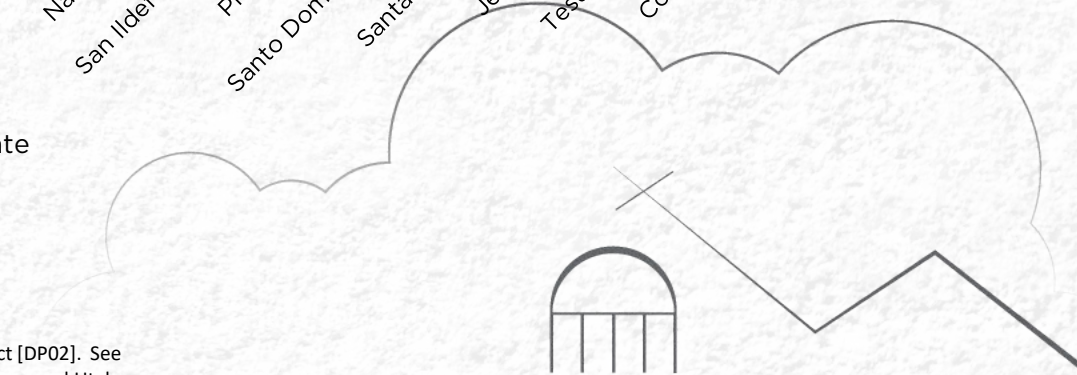
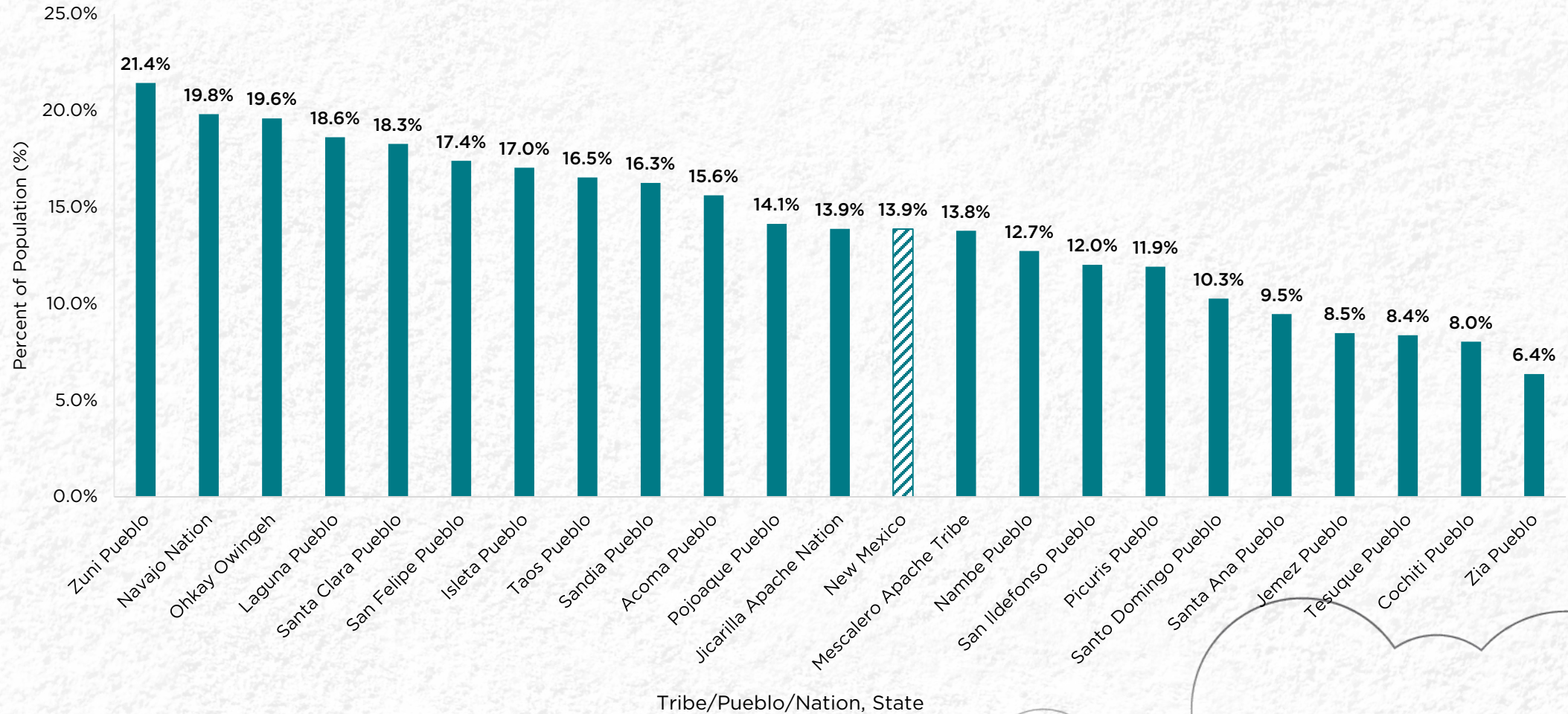


## Percent of Aged Under 18 years Population with a Disability by Tribe, Pueblo, and Nation in New Mexico, 2022



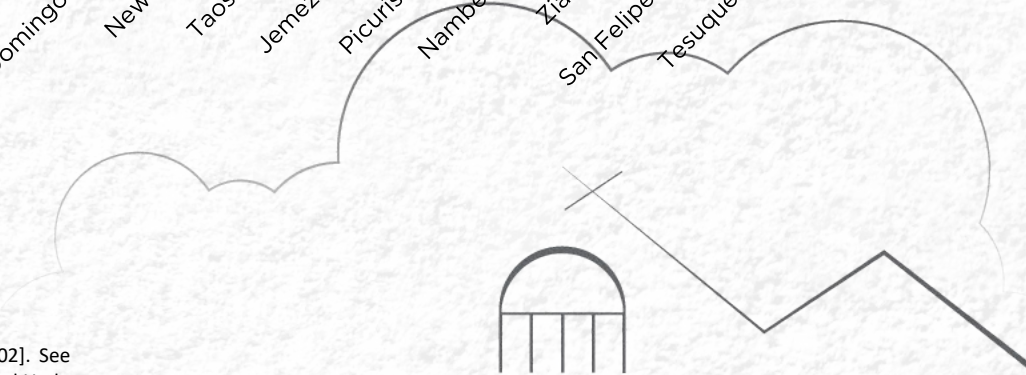
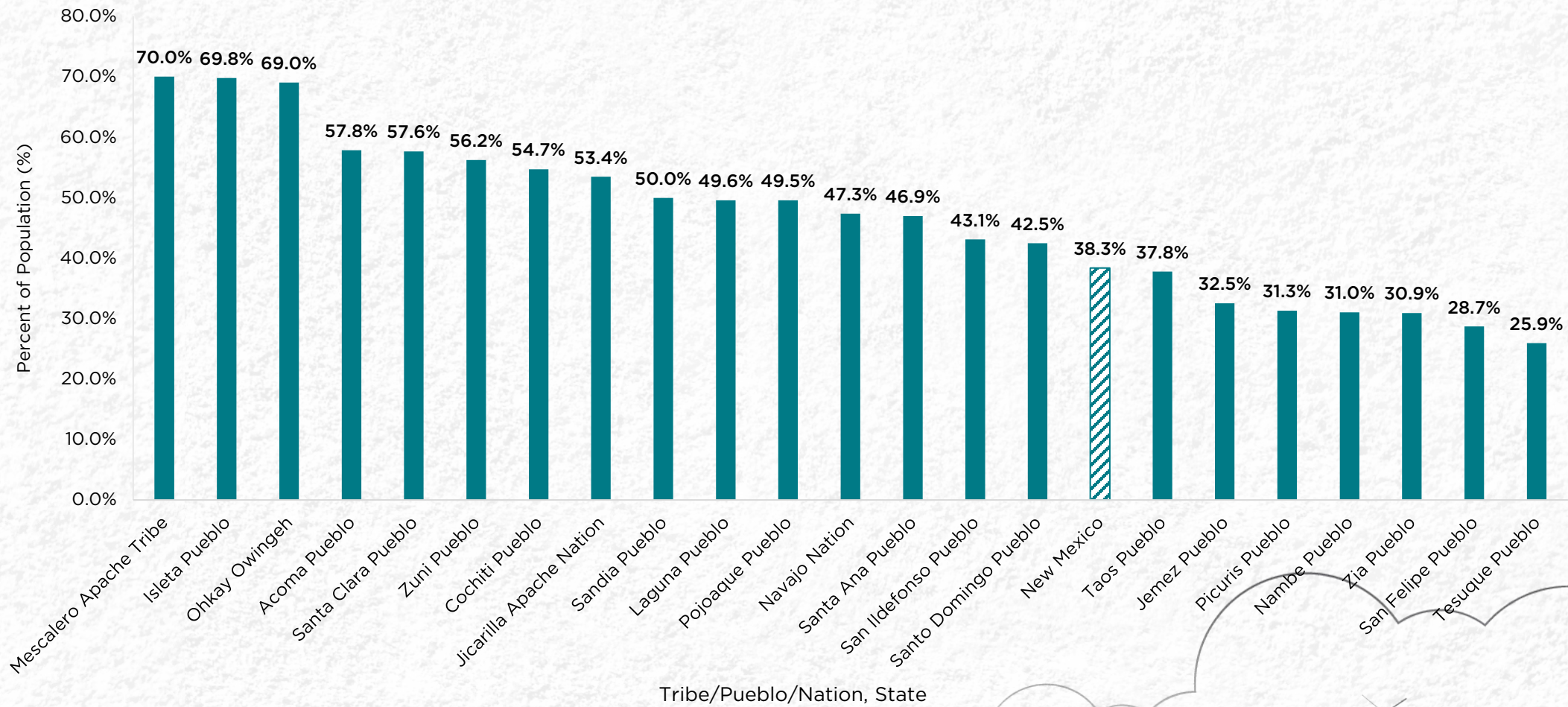


## Percent of Aged 18-64 years Population with a Disability by Tribe, Pueblo, and Nation in New Mexico, 2022



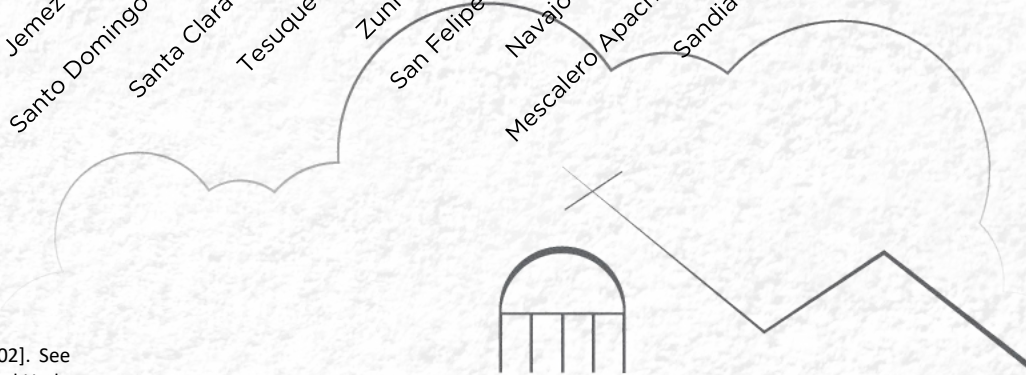
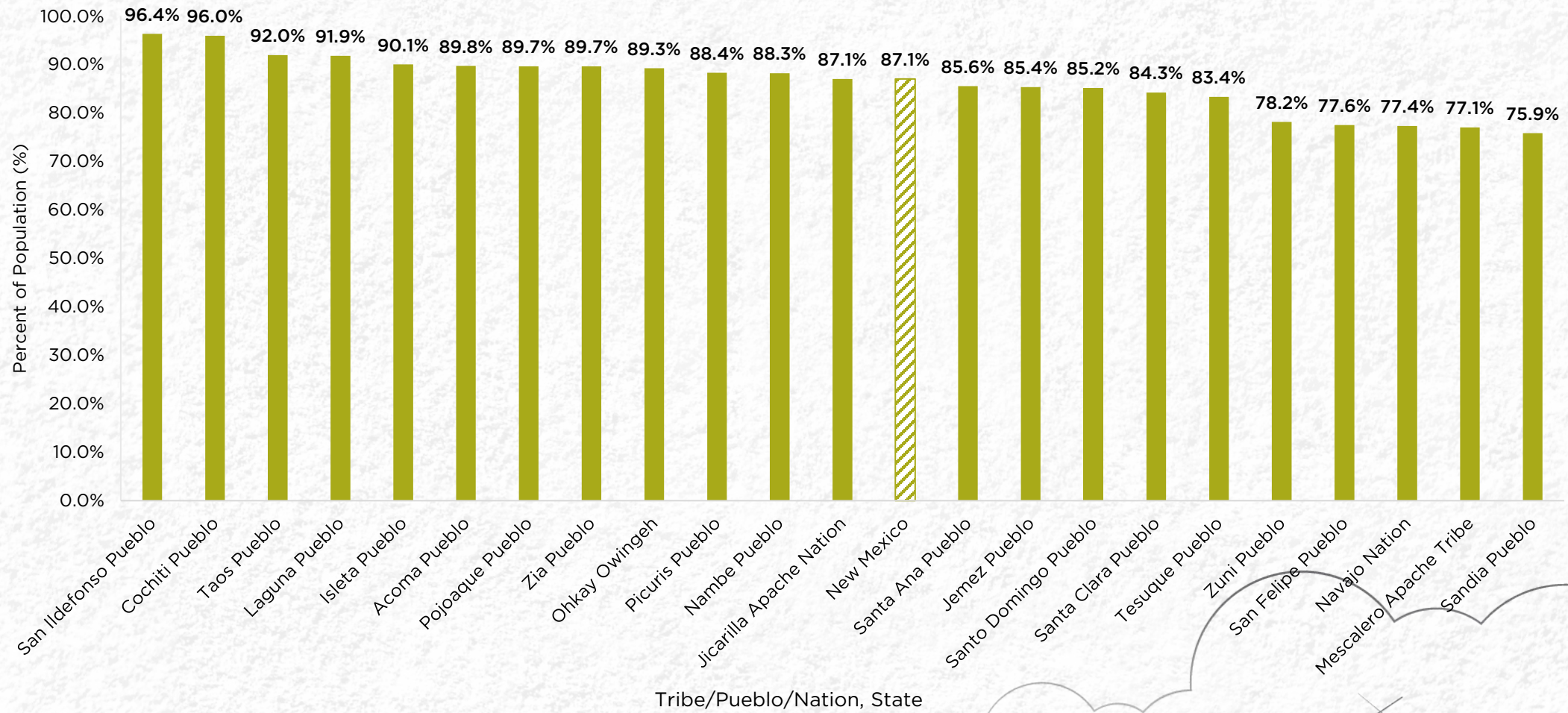


## Percent of Aged 65 years and Over Population with a Disability by Tribe, Pueblo, and Nation in New Mexico, 2022



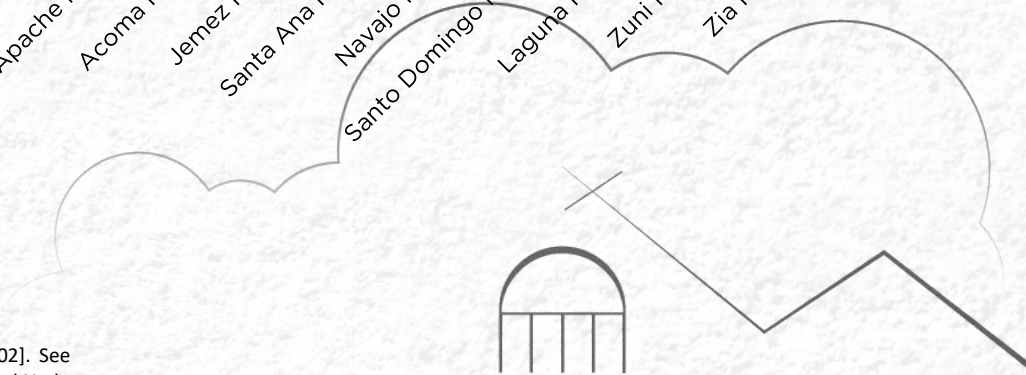
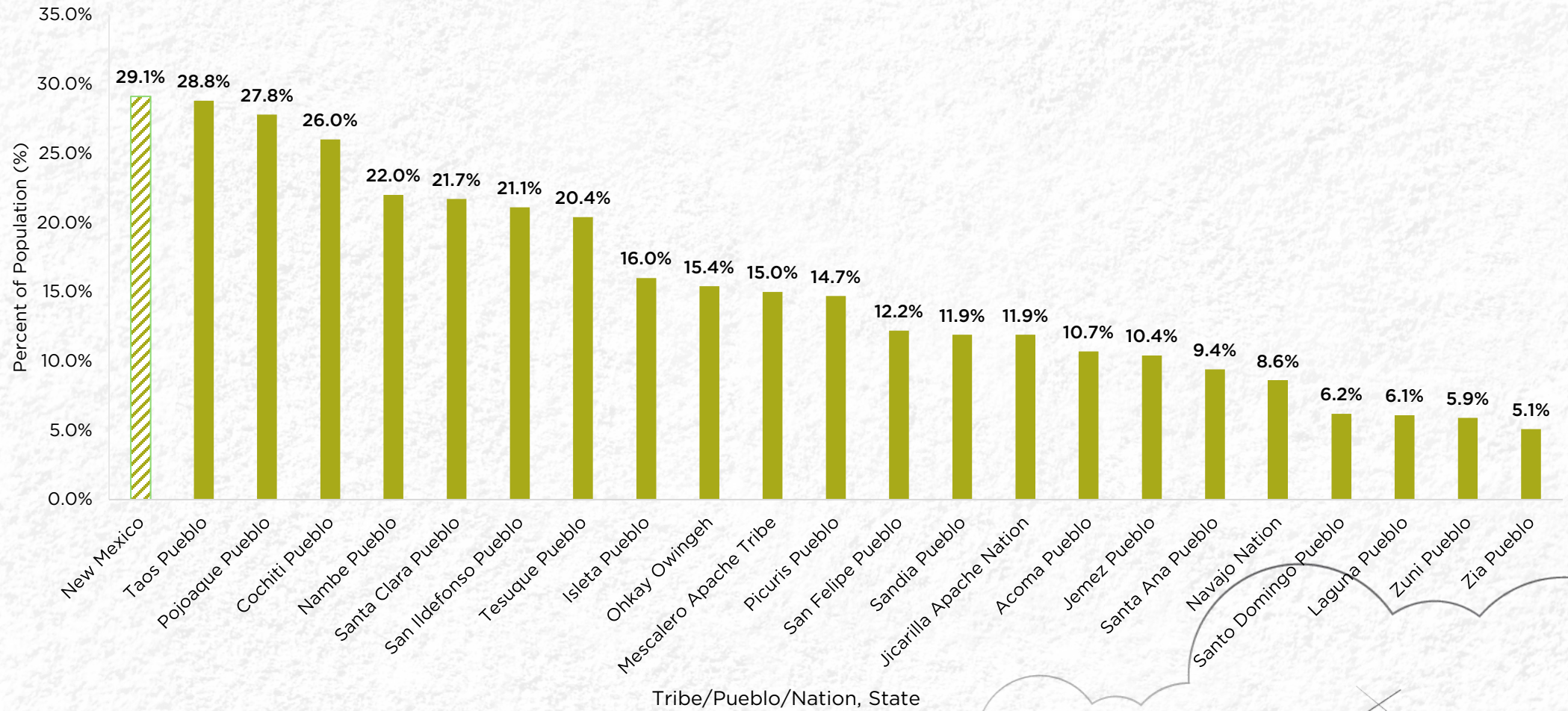


## Percent of 25 years and older Population who attained a High School Diploma or Higher by Tribe, Pueblo, and Nation in New Mexico, 2022



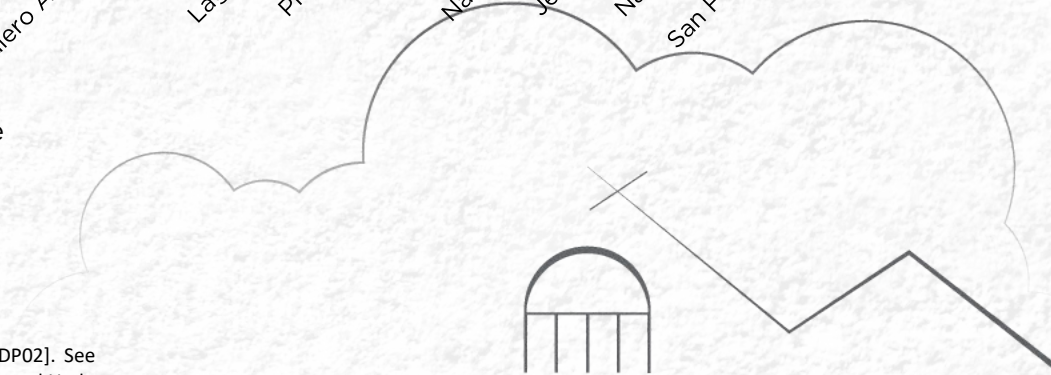
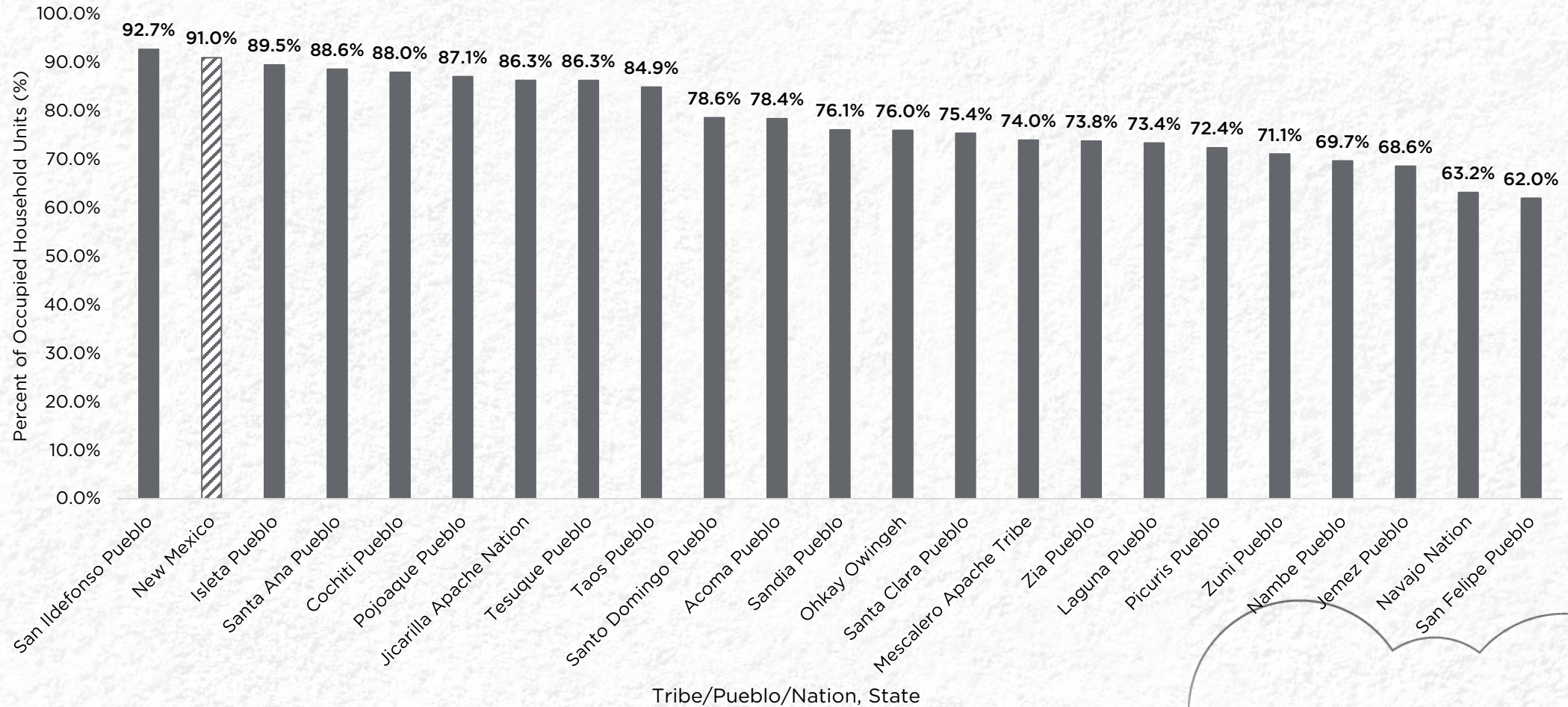


## Percent of 25 years and older Population who attained a Bachelor's Degree or Higher by Tribe, Pueblo, and Nation in New Mexico, 2022



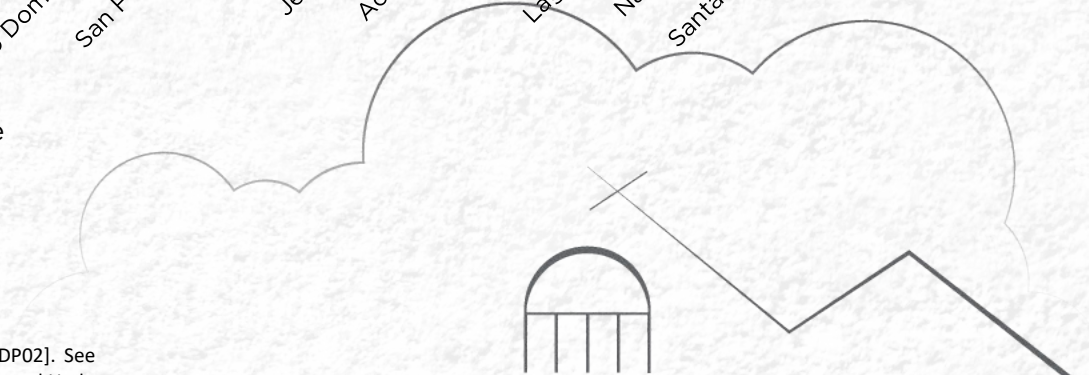
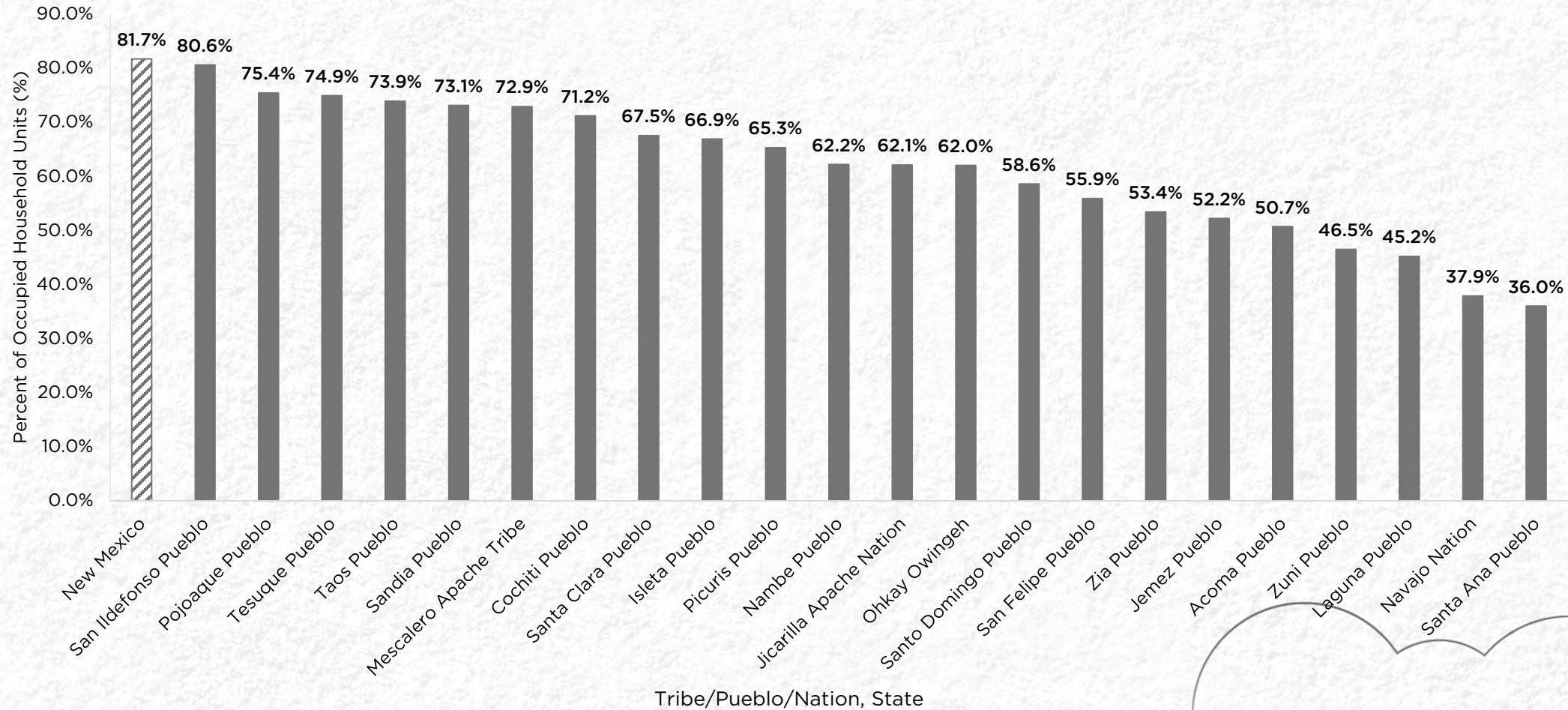


## Percent of Households with a Computer by Tribe, Pueblo, and Nation in New Mexico, 2022



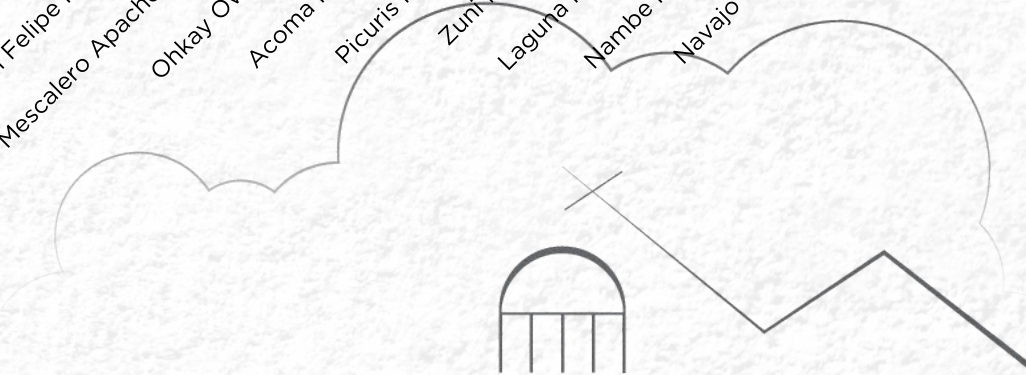
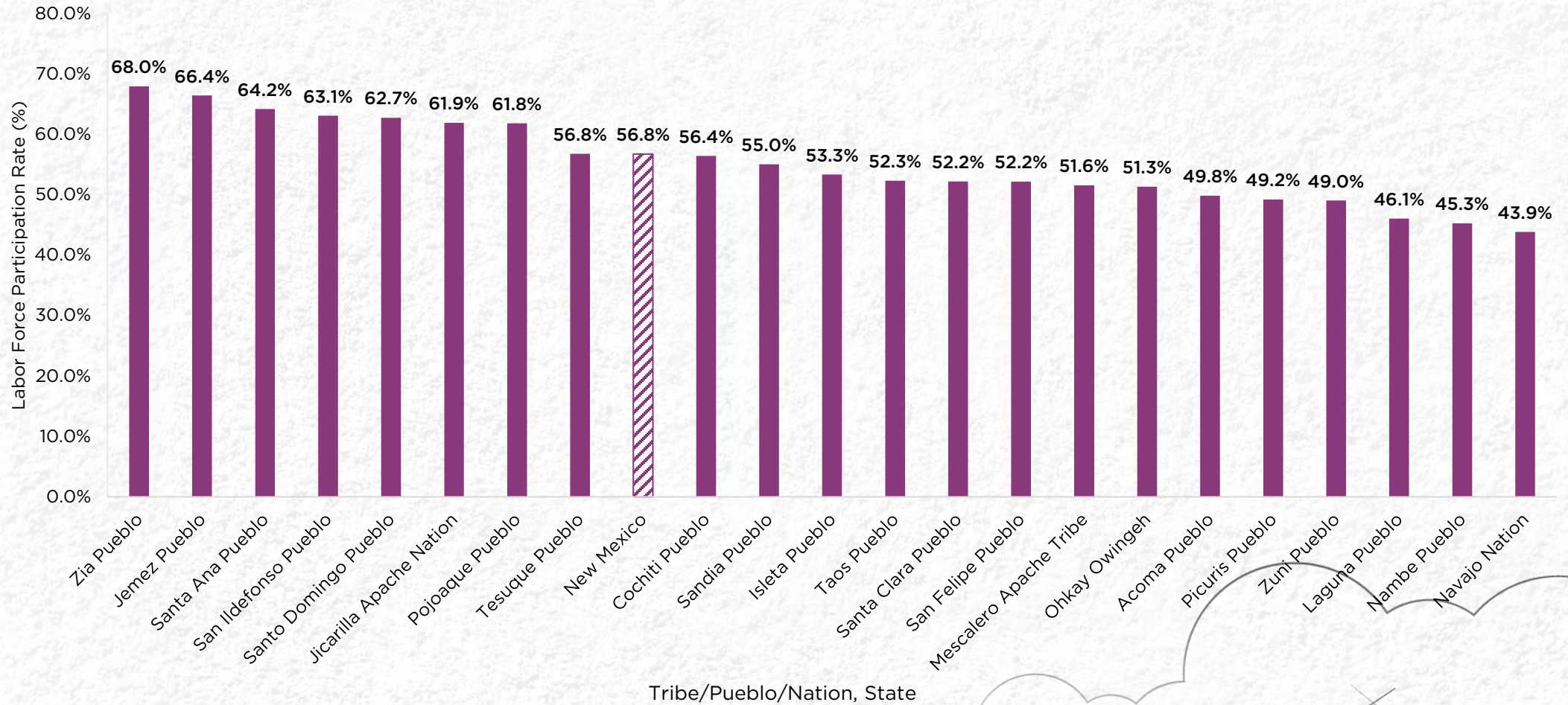


## Percent of Households with a Broadband Internet Subscription by Tribe, Pueblo, and Nation in New Mexico, 2022



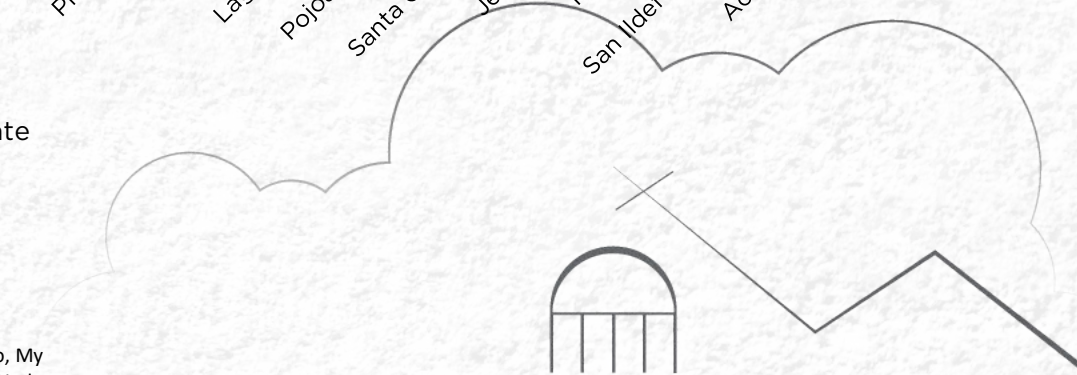
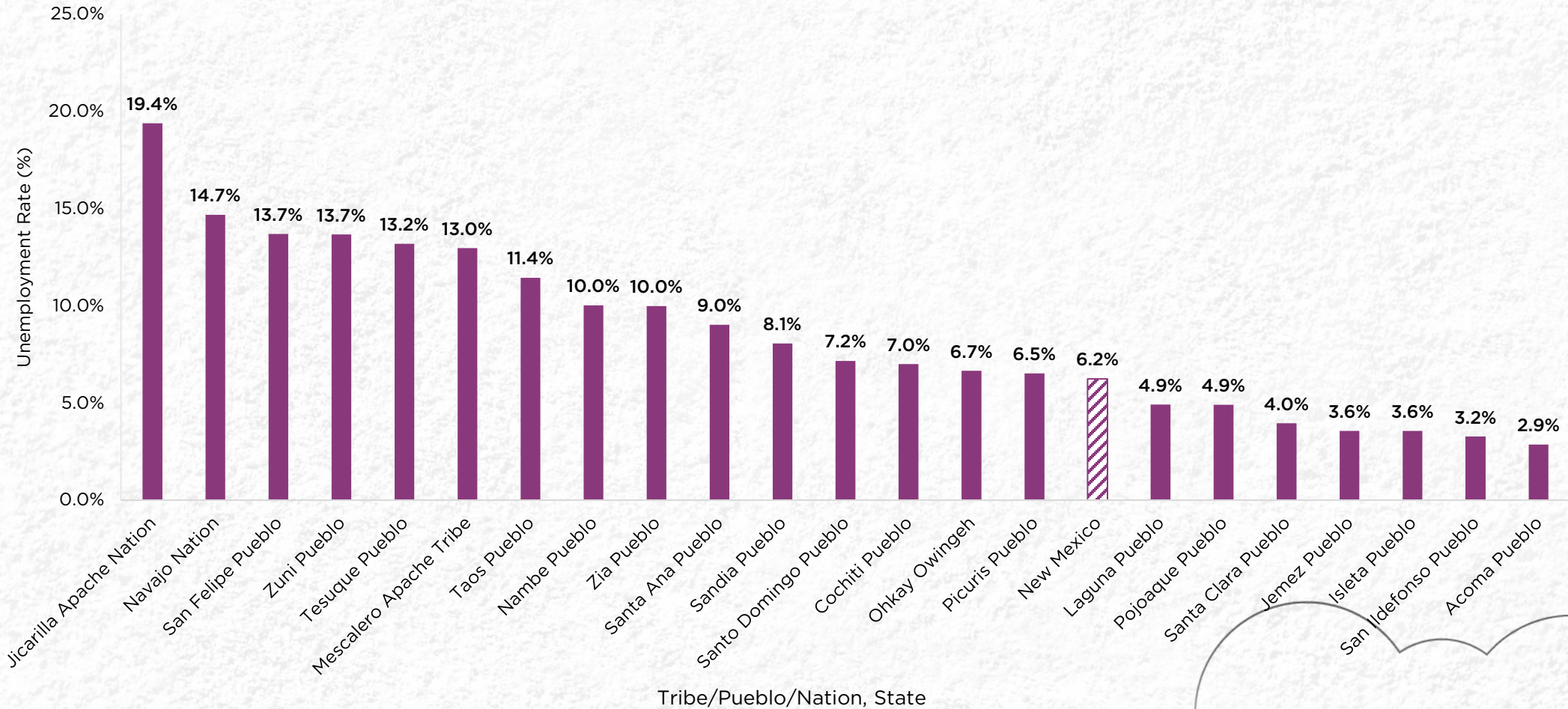


## Labor Force Participation Rate by Tribe, Pueblo, and Nation in New Mexico, 2022



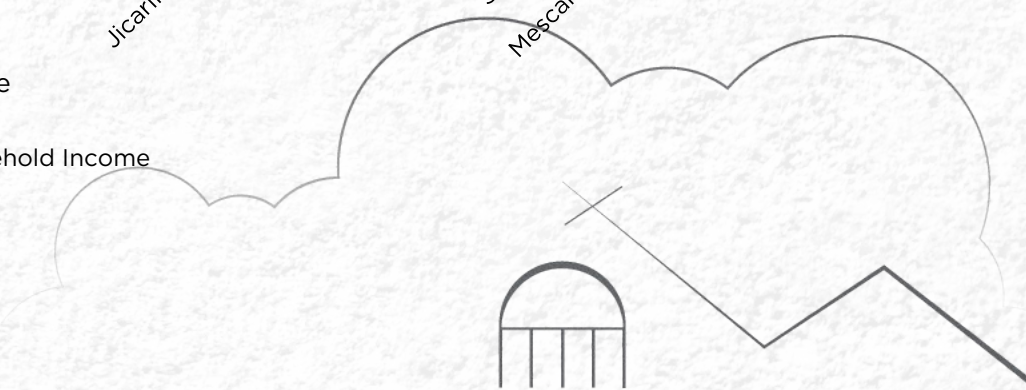
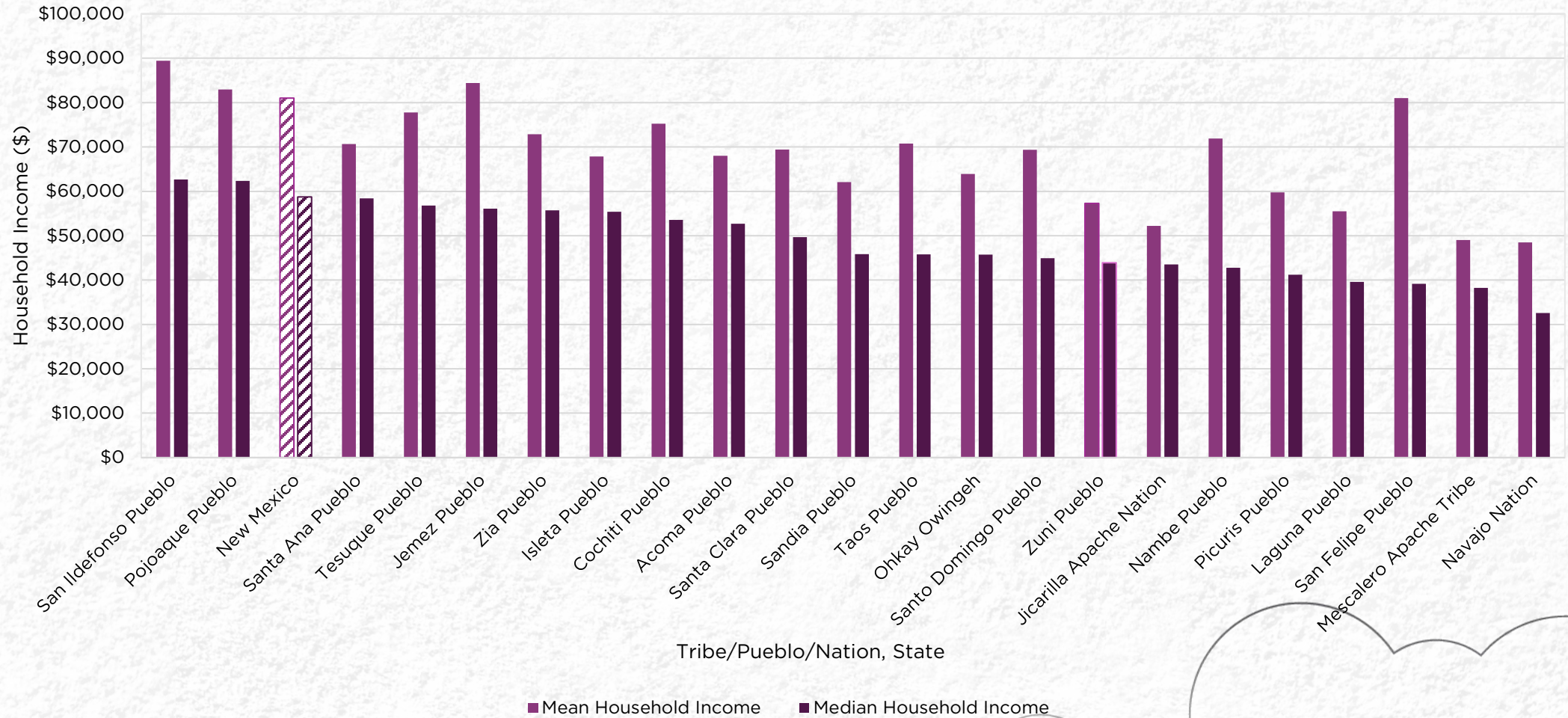


## Unemployment Rate by Tribe, Pueblo, and Nation in New Mexico, 2022



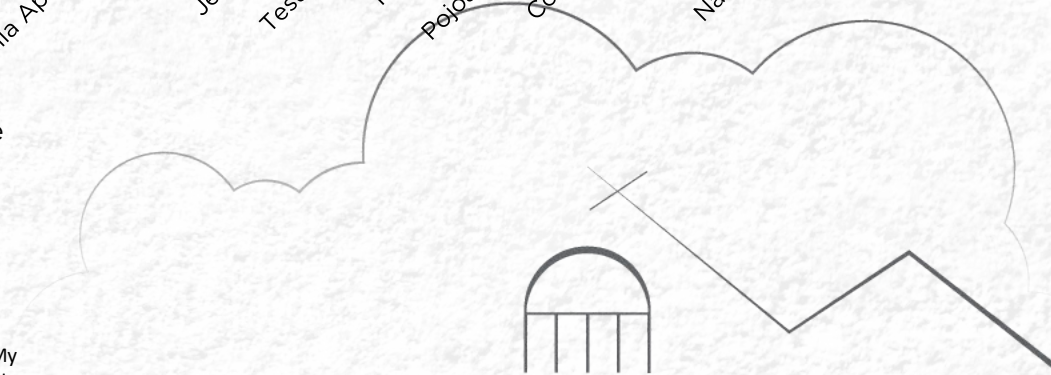
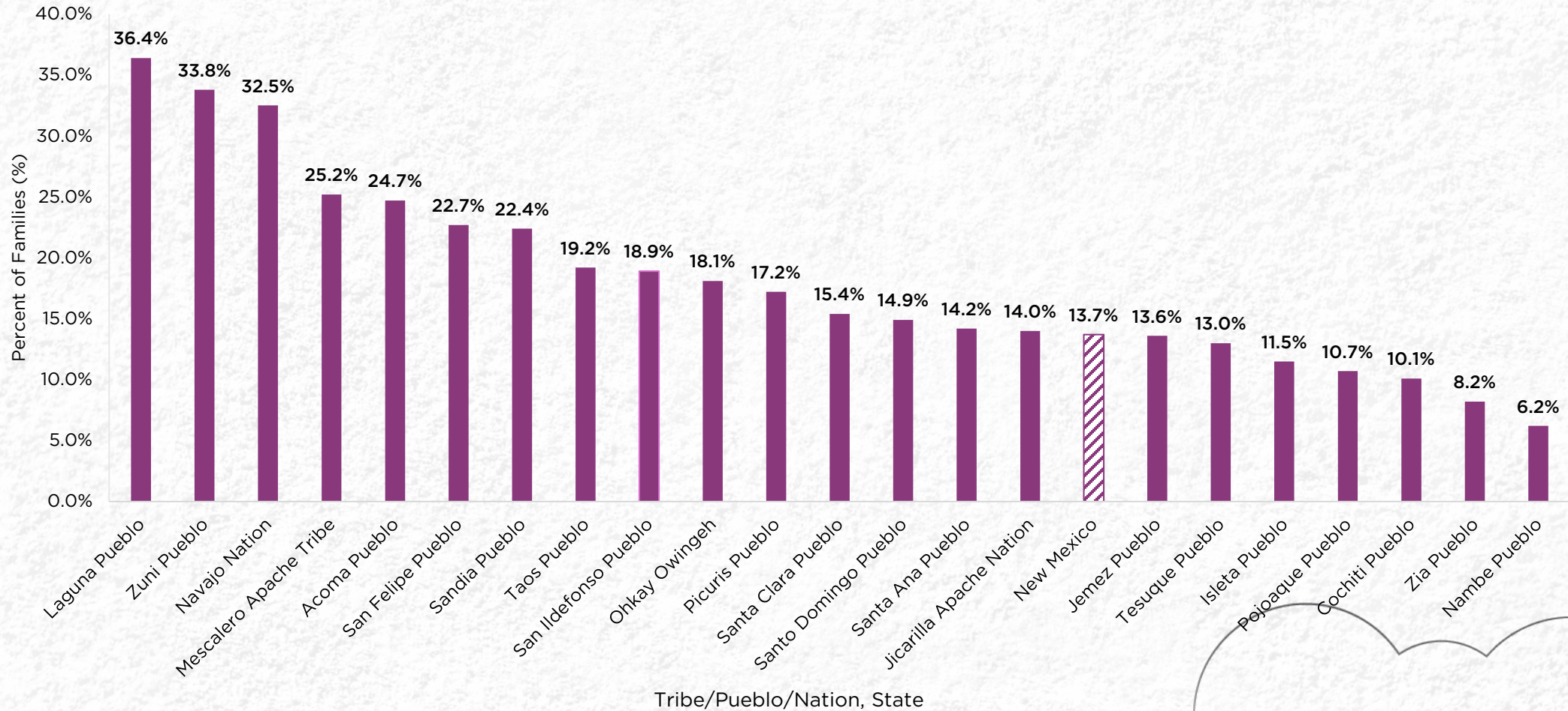


## Mean and Median Household Income by Tribe, Pueblo, and Nation in New Mexico, 2022



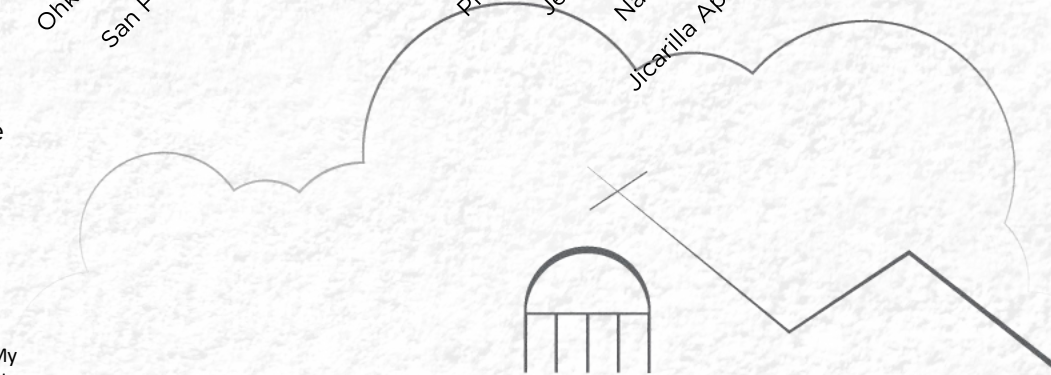
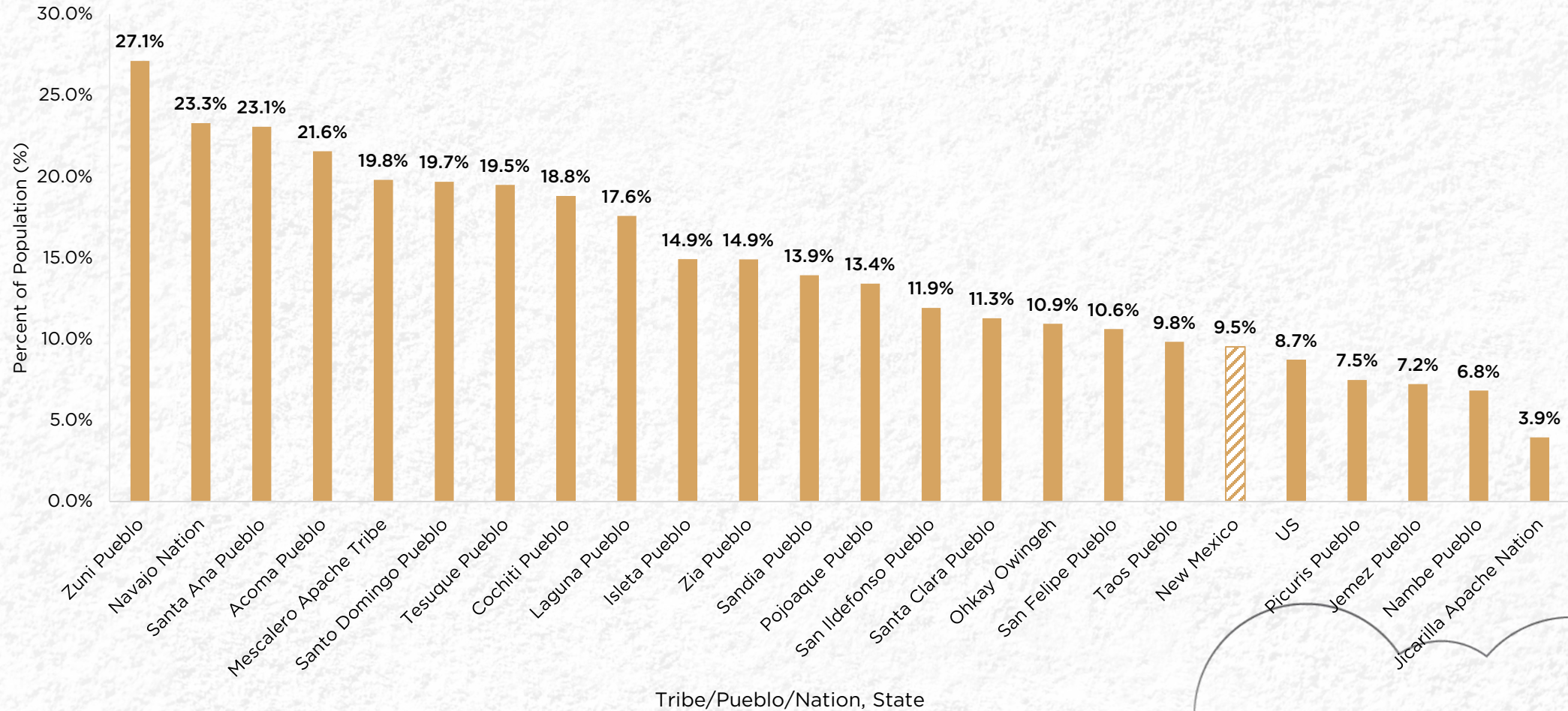


## Percent of Families Whose Income is Below the Poverty Level by Tribe, Pueblo, and Nation in New Mexico, 2022
