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
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ABOUT UNM NABPI:




Native American Student Proficiency by Subject Area and School Year in New Mexico, 2022-2023




Student Proficiency by Race/Ethnicity and Subject Area in New Mexico, School Year 2022/2023






Student Proficiency by Race/Ethnicity and Subject Area in New Mexico, School Year 2021/2022






Native American Student Proficiency by Gender and Subject Area, School Year 2021/2022






Native American Student Proficiency by Disability Status and Subject Area, School Year 2021/2022






Native American Student Proficiency by Free and Reduced Lunch Status and Subject Area, School Year 2021/2022






Graduation Rates by Race/Ethnicity in New Mexico, School Year 2021/2022




Attendance Rates by Race/Ethnicity in New Mexico, School Year 2021/2022


